In recent years, many therapist and clients have expressed an interest in online therapy and supervision. While many therapists and clients alike are concerned about participating in online therapy, for a variety of legitimate reasons, there seems to be an emerging interest on the part of both therapists and clients in online provision of services. For the systemically oriented practitioner, there are more questions than there are for those doing individual therapy:

- How do we hear each person's story?
- How can we speak to families and couples about their relationships in a safe way from a distance?
- Will the online platform be HIPAA compliant?
- How can one give informed consent and obtain consent for treatment documents online?

These are only a few of the relevant questions that will be addressed in this workshop which explores the nuts and bolts of online therapy.

This workshop offers a comprehensive overview for doing online therapy. It is a very useful workshop for those who want to do online therapy and want guidance in terms of how to do it skillfully, legally, ethically, and helpfully.

Training Objectives:

1. Participants in this workshop will be able to articulate the essence of KRS 335.380, including the statute's definition of tele-health; the requirement to obtain informed consent before treatment begins, and the statute's requirement to maintain the confidentiality of client's health information.
 - A. Participants will be able to describe the process in which clients rights and duty to warn information is given via streaming video and clients then sign and fax or scan the consent the form back to the therapist before beginning therapy.
 - B. Participants will be able to describe how to select streaming video platforms which can be used in HIPAA compliant ways for conducting online systemic therapy.
2. Participants will be able to describe how to work with a couple or family to situate their camera, so that therapists can visually see each person participating in the therapy in a way in which each participant can be seen from "head to toe," rather than just "head shots" of the clients.
3. Participants will be able to describe how to asses clients for the appropriateness of online therapy.
4. Participants will be able to describe how to manage "the talk" in online therapy so that each voice of the family member or couple who are participating is adequately heard.
